



Our LC3 Board is the governing body responsible for ensuring that the organization remains aligned with its mission, protects the integrity of the community voice, and drives meaningful system change. The Board provides oversight, strategic direction, and decision-making to create equitable access to services, particularly in the Behavioral Health (BH) system.

Board Structure

The composition of our LC3 board consists of 9 members, with a diverse set of backgrounds, expertise, and lived experiences.

These members are voted for by LC3 general members and selected for their ability to contribute to the mission of the organization, particularly in improving access to services and advocating for systemic change in the BH sector.

The LC3 Board's primary responsibility is to ensure that the voice of the community -especially those receiving behavioral health services—is heard and prioritized. It also guards against any self-driven, agency-driven, or politically motivated agendas that may dilute the impact of community-driven decisions, ensuring fidelity to community needs that helps maintain the organization's relevance and trustworthiness.

Direction of Community Projects

A staple in our local collaborative 3 would be our community projects. The board votes on and approves community projects and initiatives aimed at improving services and access to care. Each community project is designed with the goal of creating long-term, sustainable improvements in the BH system. These projects are evaluated to ensure they align with the Board's mission and contribute to meaningful system change.

Voting and Decision-Making

The LC3 board holds monthly meetings where major decisions are discussed and voted upon. Key votes typically include approving strategic direction, and community projects that affect the organization's operations and mission.

Our board members are expected to make decisions based on collective input, evidence, and the overarching goal of improving the BH system.



LC3 METRICS - COST

LC3 serves as a critical platform for collaboration and resource-sharing, demonstrated by high attendance rates and the distribution of over 1,600 free Continuing Education Units (CEUs). These efforts saved New Mexico residents an estimated \$24,500-\$40,800, reducing professional development costs while enhancing access to vital training.



LC3 METRICS - TYPES OF ATTENDEES





BH/SUD Providers (262) and Government Representatives (240) form the largest attendee groups, indicating strong participation from behavioral health and public sector stakeholders.

Education (103) and Other Stakeholders/Resources (416) also have significant representation, which aligns with community-wide efforts.

Medical Providers (12), Certified Peers (10), and Tribal Members (1) are underrepresented compared to the scale of outreach needed for holistic community engagement.

Elected Officials (8) and Consumers (50) have room for growth to strengthen policymaker and end-user perspectives in discussions.







- Retain Strong Representation from Core Groups
- Maintain or slightly grow attendance for BH/SUD Providers and Government
- Representatives by fostering engagement through direct communication and shared outcomes.
- Strengthen Diversity and Inclusion
- Focus on building attendance among Tribal Members and increasing Health Council Members (53) to enhance rural and underserved community representation.
- Overall Outreach
- Establish an overarching goal of increasing total attendance by 15-20%, targeting a minimum of 1,500 attendees (from approximately 1,252 currently).
