Help Me Grow El Paso

Laura Marquez, MSW Program Supervisor at the Paso del Norte Children's Development Center shared the progress developing a Help Me Grow model initiative for early childhood interventions to serve children 0-8 years of age and their families. She explained that their program not only provides opportunity for parental learning about myths and facts surrounding early childhood behaviors, but they also provide options for assessment and closed loop referrals to local resources. What is Help Me Grow?

Help Me Grow is a nationally implemented, evidence-base model that supports early identification and resource linkage for children at-risk of experiencing developmental, behavioral, medical, and educational concerns.



Why Help Me Grow?


Driving Factors in Universal Early Identification Efforts:

- * Texas is home to 1,113,391 babies*
- \$ 80% of brain development occurs by age 3, with 90% occurring by
 age 5
- **1 in 4** children can experience a developmental delay, with **1 in 6** being diagnosed with a disability
- **80**% of children experiencing developmental and/or behavioral concerns do not receive timely intervention



How does Help Me Grow Work?

- A Centralized Access Point connects families with children 0-8 years old to resources.
- **Family & Community Outreach** keeps families engaged and informed about healthy child development.
- **Child Health Care Provider Outreach** supports early detection efforts through training and connection to community resources.
- Data Collection & Analysis supports evaluation to identify system gaps, drive advocacy efforts, and guide quality improvements.

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
