#### Back to School

LC3 & FYI+ are proud to join the Village of Hatch Coalition for the 2nd Annual Back to School Event and Resource Fair on Wednesday, July 31, 2025, from 11 AM–3 PM at Hatch Valley High School. Ahead of the event, our team partnered with Hatch stakeholders, Success Partnership, and others to fill backpacks with school supplies and resources—all to be distributed free to local families.

### Mindfulness & Self Care

On July 24, LC3 and the Doña Ana Village Association (DAVA) partnered to host a Mindfulness and Self-Care training for behavioral health and substance use providers in Radium Springs. Led by the National Latino Behavioral Health Association (NLBHA), the session focused on practical, evidence-based strategies to manage stress, prevent burnout, and build emotional resilience. This training is part of LC3's ongoing commitment to reach rural communities across Doña Ana County and support the well-being of those who care for others.

















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
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## Youth Crisis Convening Project

The Youth Crisis Convening Project, organized by Families and Youth Innovations Plus (FYI+), is a communitydriven, youth-led effort to understand, address, and transform the systems that respond to youth in crisis throughout Doña Ana County. This initiative created a platform to work with youth-not just for them-to codesign a Youth Crisis Response Model that reflects their lived experiences with mental health challenges, substance use, and systemic inequities, and to shape solutions that are culturally responsive, trauma-informed, and accessible.

#### Survey Demographics

- 157 respondents for crisis response survey
- Over 80% were youth respondents ages 12–24
- · Majority identified as female
- Majority identified as Hispanic/Latino or multiracial
- Majority of respondents reside in Zip-codes: 88081, 88012, 88001

Anonymous, free access to peer support, counseling, and basic needs



Being seen and heard without assumptions

#### Engagement

Organized distinct convenings for adults and youth to accommodate varying schedules, address transportation challenges, and create spaces that felt emotionally safe and welcoming.



Youth-facilitated focus groups, youth convenings, and presentations. Grounded in trauma-informed care and cultural humility.



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Prioritized accessibility for youth of all racial and gender identities, geographic locations, and socioeconomic backgrounds. Outreach spanned Las Cruces, Chaparral, Hatch, Anthony, and rural areas to meet youth where they were.



Youth in Doña Ana County are calling not just for services, but for transformation. Their stories and insights offer a bold, necessary challenge to existing systems—and a clear invitation to do better. This model was designed by youth, for youth. It centers healing relationships, cultural humility, and accessible care. Through collective action, we can build a system where all young people feel safe, supported, and empowered during moments of crisis.
