Welcome and Introductions

Ivonne Tapia convened the meeting at 8:35 a.m. and called for introductions.

Nami El Paso

Isidro Torres provided an overview of programs and services NAMI El Paso currently has to offer. He shared the events that have developed in recent years including the largest mental health awareness event in the region, the NAMI Walk. Mr. Torres emphasized programs that help engage youth and family members of youth in learning experiences, volunteerism, and opportunities to become trainers for educational programs. He added that there are about 80 volunteers and navigator specialists working to help families in need. Mr. Torres also shared his experiences as the current interim NAMI Texas Executive Director. A role that provides opportunities for him to share invited testimony at State legislative committee meetings. He responded to questions from the group. Several FLC partners shared their policy concerns for him to include as opportunities come up. **Presentation slides and handout copies are included with these notes.**

Texas Tech HSC El Paso and YAM Program

Ms April Corral could not make it to the meeting but send a statement and a flyer to share with the group. The following statement was read to the group:

Texas Tech Health Sciences Center El Paso would like to share an exciting opportunity that is coming to our community through the Youth Aware of Mental Health (YAM) program. YAM is an evidence-based mental health promotion and suicide prevention initiative designed to help young people strengthen coping skills, increase mental health awareness, and support help-seeking behaviors. As Texas Tech HSC works to expand access to this meaningful program, they are seeking school districts interested in collaborating through a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to bring YAM to students within their schools. This partnership would help us create a coordinated effort to support youth mental wellness and equip students with valuable tools to navigate life's challenges. Texas Tech believes YAM aligns well with the shared goal of fostering healthy, resilient school communities. Participation would provide an opportunity to make a lasting impact on the well-being of students while strengthening community-wide support for mental health awareness. They welcome the opportunity to discuss the program in greater detail, answer any questions, and explore how a partnership could be structured to meet the needs of area school districts.

A one page brochure with additional information on the program is included with these notes.

Specialty Care Work Group

Nicole Schiff summarized the actions that took place during the last Specialty Care work group meeting. Ms. Tapia, in her role as CEO of Aliviane, elaborated on the concept for a new residential treatment center option in El Paso. Together they shared the development history leading to where the project is today. The group entered into a lively discussion about the significant barriers

that need to be overcome for the project to become a reality. Rhonda Russ commented that the need includes individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. The group discussed residential versus outpatient options in the community and across the state. Ms Schiff called for a list of residential centers shared in previous meetings. This list is included with these notes. Ms. Tapia shared that as the project comes closer to reality, the needs continue to grow as anticipated that the numbers in need are conservative and thanks to the active FLC collaborations we are overcoming these barriers. The group recognized the importance of this project now more than ever. Ms. Schiff recognized Ms. Vanessa Leon and the Heart Gallery of El Paso for the improvements in their data tracking and programs to help address needs for youth in similar situations. Ms. Schiff, Ms. Leon, and Ms. Tapia responded to questions from the group. Presentation slides and meeting notes from the Specialty Care Work Group are included with these notes.

Cannabis and Mothers

Enrique Mata Shared a 4 minute video with mothers on social media who smoke marijuana to better cope with the stressors of motherhood. The group entered into a lively discussion about the multitude of concerns with parents normalizing the use of Cannabis related products. While no specific solutions were identified to counter the concerns for this growing problem, comments from the group included greater vigilance and seeking out options to educate individuals and families, especially those with young children, that behavior of this type carries both short and long term harms to the children and the family as a whole.

Other Business

YMCA of El Paso – Ms. Gilda Gil shared a flyer inviting everyone to the ribbon cutting ceremony for the Fred Loya Branch Soccer Field. The event will be held at 10:30 am on Wednesday, July 15th. **The flyer for this event is included with these notes.**

HOW DOES A SCHOOL ENGAGE?

Any principal, counselor, teacher, staff member, parent, community member or student can contact their YAM-providing institution to start the process of bringing YAM to their ISD or school. Once contact is made, we strongly encourage information sessions be held and attended for all stakeholders to ensure all questions about the program are addressed.

HOW MUCH MONEY AND TIME WILL YAM COST MY SCHOOL?

Investment The program is offered at no cost to public and charter schools/districts in Texas and the estimated value of this program is incalculable when considering its correlation with healthy adolescent development, depression prevention through fostering resilience, and increased mental health literacy and help-seeking behaviors.

Time Please work with your YAM provider to create a YAM class schedule that works best for your school and students. YAM is often provided in two and a half 90-minute sessions or five 45-60-minute sessions.

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Youth Aware of Mental Health (YAM; www.y-a-m.org) is a 5-session evidence-based program promoting increased knowledge and awareness of mental health in adolescents. Students build problem-solving skills and emotional intelligence through lectures, discussions, and role plays.

When compared to other similar programs, YAM was proven to be more effective in improving adolescent mental health and is associated with significant reductions in suicide attempts and severe suicidal ideation.

WHO PARTICIPATES IN YAM?

The program is appropriate for 8th through 12th graders. YAM is a universal evidence-based program that promotes mental health in youth, meaning all students within a grade should participate in the program, not just a subset of students. As in keeping with fidelity of the program, students can participate as much or as little as they want.



WHO WORKS WITH STUDENTS?

A certified YAM facilitator and helper will work with students. All facilitators:

- have prior experience working with groups of youth as teachers, social workers, counselors, school psychologists, or youth workers.
- are completely vetted and screened.

Welcome and Introductions

Nicole Schiff welcomed the group and called for introductions.

Overview of Last Meeting

Ms. Schiff reflected on the last meeting of the Specialty Care Work Group and on the series of meetings of task forces such as the Residential Treatment Center Task Force and the Eating Disorders Task Force explaining that the Specialty Care work group works to address the gaps in the system of care where some of the most complex cases are handled. She recognized the visionary efforts of the partners who have been working tirelessly to develop lasting solution to community level problems.

Residential Treatment Center

Ms. Ivonne Tapia, in her role as CEO of Aliviane, presented with Guillermo Valenzuela on the concept for a new residential treatment center option in El Paso. They shared the development history leading to where the project is today. There are still significant barriers that need to be overcome but the project is now more

reality than dream. Ms. Tapia recognized the importance of this project now more than ever with the Specialty Care work group partners sharing their data showing increased need. The presentation includes slides that show the campus rendering. The next steps are to work with the City and the County in hopes of gaining a level of collaborative funding support to share as the State legislature is approached for support. Members of the Specialty Care work group and the Consortium may be called upon to share their experience and expertise in how this project will help make a lasting impact on the health of our community.

Heart Gallery of El Paso

Vanessa Leon provided an overview of the progress made during her two year tenure with the project. The data, tracking, and end results show tremendous wins in the region thanks to the efforts of the Heart Gallery Team and Board. In addition, the post-adoption funding opportunities and contribution from Texas Alliance for Child and Family Services (TACFS) are bringing more support programs to the community. For example, A TACFS boot camp will open up for youth and families over the summer. Ms. Leon responded to questions from the group. A lively discussion on how both the Residential Treatment Center and the Heart Gallery have multiple opportunities to collaborate for optimal outcomes for children and youth with the most complex conditions and most dire need for support. Presentation slides are included with these notes.

Next Steps

- The **next meeting of the Specialty Care work group is set for Tuesday, July 21st**. Ms. Schiff asked the group to share the contact information for organization or person who needs to be invited to participate with this group.
- **Ms. Meeting Structure**
Nicole Schiff shared that attempts at developing a graphic representation of the continuum of care with areas where significant opportunities for improvement in policy and practice exist. She reinforced that future meetings would be called at least every other month with subcommittees meeting as needed.

NEEDS ASSESSMENT: SYSTEM GAPS & IMPACT



Critical Gap:

- No local youth residential treatment; limited mental health & substance use services for low-to-moderate income families
- Mental health ranked #1 priority; youth services #3 (El Paso Community Needs Assessment 2025)
- Families must seek treatment outside El Paso → higher costs, limited family engagement

Vulnerable population:

- 26% of El Paso's population is under the age of 18. Youth-serving agencies report significant barriers to behavioral health, housing, and education
- Youth with unmet needs become justice-involved, at risk of trafficking, or enter foster care systems without appropriate placements

Statewide shortage:

- These gaps are not unique to El Paso. Gaps reflected across Texas systems

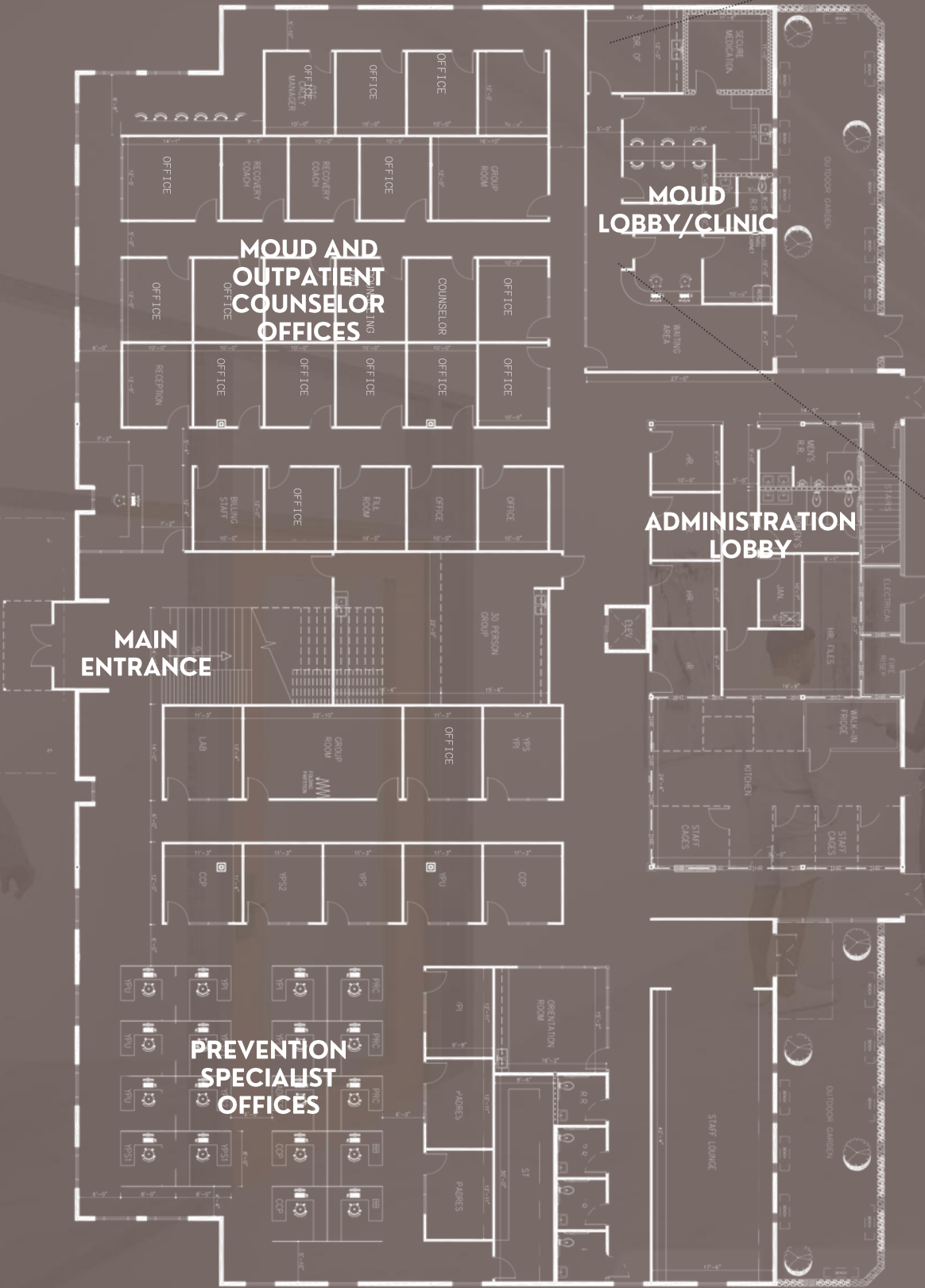
